Speaker Bio

Mark Charrette, DC is a 1980 summa cum laude graduate of Palmer College of Chiropractic in Davenport, Iowa. He is a frequent guest speaker at twelve chiropractic colleges and has taught over fourteen hundred seminars worldwide on extremity adjusting, biomechanics, and spinal adjusting techniques. His lively seminars emphasize a practical, hands-on approach. Dr. Charrette is a former All-American swimmer, who has authored a book on

extremity adjusting and also produced an instructional video series. Having developed successful practices in California, Nevada, and Iowa, Dr. Charrette currently resides in King George, Virginia.

Course Description

This 16-hour presentation includes a brief review of the concept of "The Noisy Joint" and new material involving the TMJ and rib adjustments. The seminar focuses on the discipline of DELIBERATE PRACTICE which involves 1) Learning/reviewing the adjustment protocols for the feet, knees, hips, wrists, elbows, shoulders, TMJ, and ribs. 2) Progressive repetition of the protocols utilizing increased speed with accuracy, and 3) Feedback on progress. This "hands-on" workshop is designed for the doctor/student to quickly acquire a higher level of adjusting skills for the most commonly encountered extremity and subluxation conditions.

It is not necessary to take a previous course from Dr. Mark Charrette although prior experience with the material will be valuable.

The cardiometabolic syndrome (CMS) is a milieu of cardiovascular and metabolic dysfunctions including obesity, hypertension, hyperlipidemia, hyperglycemia, insulin resistance, inflammation, hypercoagulation, and elevated uric acid. If not treated at the syndrome level, CMS can progress to CVD, stroke and type II diabetes. With proper screening, CMS can easily be diagnosed and treated with therapies including diet, lifestyle modifications and nutraceuticals.
